




Congratulations to the Phillips University Undergraduate & Graduate Legacy Scholars graduating this month!

Seven New Undergraduate Legacy Scholars Selected




The Undergraduate Scholarship Committee spent much of April reviewing applications for the seven open spots in the Undergraduate Legacy Scholar program. Over 110 students began the application process for these openings. The foundation is honored to share that the following students were invited to join the 2023-2024 Legacy Scholar cohort:

- Skyler Cloyd, a first-year student from Webster, Texas, attending Texas Christian University next fall where he will study music theory/composition, with his primary instrument as piano.
- Malachi Gnade, a sophomore from O'Fallon, Missouri, studying at Culver Stockton College with a major in mathematics education and minors in computer/data science and religion/philosophy.
- Lindsey Maisberger, a first-year student from McKinney, Texas, who will be attending Texas Christian University to study elementary education and minor in child development.
- Lillie Nielsen a sophomore from Nicolasville, Kentucky, with plans to attend Transylvania University.
- Joshua Oloriegbe a sophomore from Lagos, Nigeria, studying at Jarvis Christian University, majoring in nursing with a focus on nursing anesthesia.
- Elizabeth Skaggs a first-year student from Mansfield, Texas, who will be attending Culver Stockton College next year with plans to double major in political science and journalism.
- Hope Tuttle a sophomore from Bristow, Oklahoma, attending William Woods College where she is studying criminal justice with a psychology minor.

Each PU Legacy Scholar will receive up to \$9000 annually towards their academic expenses and will be involved in the leadership program including the Annual Leadership Conference and the year-round Volunteer Leadership Project.

Haymaker Newspapers Sought by Phillips Theological Seminary


