PROGRAM PROFILE

The Phillips University Legacy Foundation is dedicated to developing leaders who transform the world through making higher education more accessible, affordable and transformative. Since 2001, the Foundation has awarded over \$3 million in scholarships to more than 300 students while also providing transformative opportunities for leadership development & community impact. The Undergraduate Legacy Scholar Program provides annual merit-based scholarship awards along with opportunities for leadership development, service, growth and community.

THE PU LEGACY SCHOLAR SCHOLARSHIP

The annual scholarship ranges from \$6000 to \$9000 a year and is renewable for a maximum of four years. The scholarship can be applied to tuition, books, room, board and similar education expenses up to the institution's determined cost of attendance.

THE LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT CONFERENCE

All Legacy Scholars attend the leadership conference **the second weekend in October** from Thursday through Sunday. The conference includes opportunities for learning, community and growth. Travel, housing, meals and program costs on site are fully funded. Participants must arrange their own travel to and from the airport.

THE VOLUNTEER LEADERSHIP PROJECT

Each year, Legacy Scholars engage in a project of their choice with the goal of making an impact in their community while putting into practice critical leadership skills. Projects work with a campus or community advisor, foundation liaisons to grow both their own experiences and their communities in meaningful ways.

PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY

Minimum Requirements Include:

- Be enrolled at an eligible institution in the 2024-2025 school year full time (for a minimum of twelve hours each semester)
- Have an estimated college graduation date that is no earlier than December 2026 or May 2027 (usually a rising first year or sophomore college student).
- Be able and willing to participate fully in the program including but not limited to the Leadership Conference & Project.
- While there is no GPA minimum, all applicants should hold a strong academic record along with outstanding recommendations.
- Show involvement and leadership roles that shows a desire to learn, be challenged and make a positive impact on their campuses and communities.
